Beautification of our community was undertaken by members of the RHCA association. Daffodil bulbs were planted in the median all along Union Turnpike from the Grand Central Parkway almost up to Winchester Boulevard. Contributing to the effort were RHCA Board members Marie de Angelis, Suwarna Rambukpotha and Jesse Vukich along with RHCA member Josette Jean Baptiste.

Winter is almost upon us. It is time to put away all the lawn chairs, tables and other items or pieces of furniture we have used to help us enjoy the good weather. Leaving these items out to the elements will only hasten their destruction but when left out they can serve as an attraction to thieves, vandals, and persons who will treat them as their local park bench.

Democracy and Voter Turnout

In1960 we had a 63.1% voter turnout rate for people of voting age. In recent history it was only a little over 50% and in 1996 dropped down to 49.1%. These statistics are from presidential election years. The non-presidential election years were much worse, often not much better than 36%. This year, our early statistics indicate about a 64.1 % voter turnout rate. It is an improvement but we still have a long way to go before we can consider ourselves a vibrant democracy where all citizens partake in this government of, for and by the people.

Congratulations to the elected officials who serve our area on their re-election. Congressman Gary Ackerman, Assembly Member Mark Weprin, and Assembly Member Barbara Clark. As of this writing, Senator Frank Padavan holds a slim lead over Councilman James Gennaro. We have also witnessed the historic election of our first African American President. We wish him well and hope and trust that he will guide our great country and help bring it peace and prosperity.

Home owner rebate has been cancelled. All homeowners had been promised a \$400 rebate on the increased taxes we had paid. Unfortunately, due to the financial crisis the Mayor has cancelled it.

Dues collections for the Rocky Hill Civic Association now stands at 265 homes for 2008. This is down significantly from the well over 300 homes that contributed in 2007. Last year we had received additional funding to help us raise dues collections and participation in our civic association. The efforts were quite successful but without the additional effort dues contribution levels have once again diminished. I ask all those members who have not contributed their dues for 2008 to do so before the end of the year. All the work we do is for the whole community and it should be supported by the whole community not just by some.
